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Fr. Principal's Message

“Violence Against 50% of the Population of India”



As India prides itself as a growing economic and military power, the world is taking stock of things happening in India. There are many fronts for Indians to feel proud of India's growth. From a country which was synonymous with poverty and illiteracy, India has come a long way and we find the social indicators going North. But one of the indicators which is getting worse is the way women, who are half of the population, are treated in India. Reports say that crimes against women are reported in every two minutes in India. We find violence against women on an increase and the society,

dominated by male politicians and powerful persons pretend as if crimes and violence against women are not matters of importance in the society. Apathy shown towards matters connected with women makes the perpetrators of these crimes go bold to do more heinous crimes against women. It is also saddening that even though the number of crimes against women are on the increase, the conviction rate in these cases are not increasing proportionately. When there are political or spiritual leaders who say "boys make mistakes and why hang them?" or "the victim is as guilty as her rapists. ... She should have called the culprits brothers and begged before them to stop", we cannot expect emancipation of women from the clutches of male chauvinists in India.

A nation's standing in social sphere could be measured by the way the women and children are treated in that society. In the list of nations

where atrocities against women are committed most, India stands fourth and that is not a fame list to be included into. What can help to redeem India from this deplorable situation is what we need to discuss. Some of the measures which I believe that can reverse the increasing occurrences of violence against women could be increasing conscientization works against such violence, making the law and punishment stricter against the perpetrators of these offences, and imparting education. Only when the Indian society takes up this matter as a challenge that can destroy the very fabric of the society and work in tandem with the government and NGOs with a firm resolve to address this issue, can we make a beginning to end violence against women. I pray that such a beginning may start soon.
