 - 7) What was the pestilence that gripped Calcutta in the poem 'Pestilence in Nineteenth Century Calcutta'?
 - 8) Mention a few of the things the poet has loved in 'The Great Lover'.
 - 9) What parts of the human body are mentioned by the poet in 'Mushrooms'?
- II. Answer any six of the following in about 150-200 words, choosing one each from prose, short stories and poetry.
 (6×6=36)
 - 1) What were the pleasures of the Elizabethans according to Huxley?
 - 2) What are L.A.G. Strong's views on 'Reading' in the essay 'Reading for Pleasure'?
 - 3) Why does Russell feel that some amount of force is necessary to make human beings lead a safe and lawful life?
 - 4) Write a short note on Sher Singh's family.
 - 5) Why was Wolfgang sent to Paris to finish his studies?
 - 6) Why did the conviction of the accused seem a foregone conclusion in 'A Case for the Defence'?



- 7) How does the poem 'Pestilence in Nineteenth Century Calcutta' project imperialistic India under the heady influence of an alien culture?
- 8) How does Sylvia Plath describe 'Mushrooms' in her poem?
- 9) Comment on the wonder of the Hawk's creation in the poem 'Hawk Roosting'.

 - 8) The poem 'Mushrooms' intones the expression of a collective anguished self. Elucidate.
 - 9) Bring out the philosophy behind the poem 'Hawk Roosting'.
